Nationwide Incidence Rate

1 in 8 men will be diagnosed during his lifetime 3.1M men currently diagnosed

This year in the United States...

New cases: 288,300 Deaths: 34,700

Veterans are 1.5x more likely to get prostate cancer.

African-American men are 2.1x more likely to die of prostate cancer.

Incidence Rate in District of Columbia

131.3 in every 100,000 men diagnosed 26.9 in every 100,000 men die from the disease

CDC's National Comprehensive Cancer Control Program (NCCCP) Funding in District of Columbia:

- GOAL 1: Reduce morbidity and mortality due to prostate cancer in the District.
- Objective 1: Through the provision of professional and public education, improve the appropriateness of prostate cancer screening for District residents.
- Objective 2: Establish a standard for community prostate screening process, including education and informed decision-making.
- Objective 3: Increase the early detection and appropriate management of clinically relevant prostate cancerÑcases with a high probability of rapid tumor growthÑto mitigate adverse impact on chances of survival and quality of life.
- Objective 4: Reduce the proportion of unstaged prostate cancer cases for all races from the 2004-2008 Surveillance Epidemiology and End-Year Results (SEER) baseline rate of 11.7 to less than 3.

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
