CDC's National Comprehensive Cancer Control Program (NCCCP) Funding in Arizona:

- **Goal:** Detect Cancer Early.
- **Objective:** Increase the number of men, 40 and older, who have worked with their provider to create a plan for their prostate health.
- **Indicators:** Percent of men discussing/creating a prostate health plan with their provider.
- **Status:** Under development (at this time, there is discussion and disagreement among providers and across organizations about prostate cancer screening. If we selected a protocol for prostate cancer screening many providers would disagree).
- **Objective:** Decrease late stage diagnosis for breast, cervical, colorectal, prostate, and lung. Regular, timely cancer screening reduces late stage diagnosis. With clinics and health plans focused on increasing their screening rates, the proportion of late stage diagnosis will decrease over time.
