CDC's National Comprehensive Cancer Control Program (NCCCP) Funding in Colorado:

- Goal: Increased high-quality cancer screening and early detection rates.
- **Objective:** Increase high-quality, guideline-adherent cancer screening rates among average risk individuals.
- **Strategy:** Promote informed decision-making at both the provider and individual level regarding the advantages and disadvantages of the prostate-specific antigen test for prostate cancer screening. African American men 40+ who engage in informed decision-making about prostate cancer screening and completed a PSA test. Baseline: 31.8%, 2020 Target: 36.6%.
