## CDC's National Comprehensive Cancer Control Program (NCCCP) Funding in New Hampshire:

- **Increase** the number of men age 40 and older who report having discussed prostate cancer screening with their healthcare providers (in other words, those who have made an informed decision about the screening) to 73% (baseline 68.0%, 2008). In 2009, there is no consensus among national organizations regarding prostate cancer screening. Both the ACS and the United States Preventive Services Task Force recommend that men engage in shared decision making with their physicians. To help New Hampshire men determine what is best for their needs, the NHCCC will continue to work closely with the NHOPCC to encourage informed decision making between men and their healthcare providers.
- **Strategy:** Continue to work with the NHPCC through members' presence on the NHCCC prevention and **early detection work group.**
