

JOIN VETERANS COMMUNITY CARE Introduction

FOR PROVIDERS

With the urgent need to care for Veterans with prostate cancer, there is an opportunity for providers to help. Currently, there are an estimated 500,000 prostate cancer patients in the U.S. Department of Veteran's Affairs (VA) health system and an estimated 16,000 of these patients have metastatic prostate cancer. With recently passed legislation, local providers are now able to care for Veterans and get reimbursed by being part of the VA Community Care Network (CCN).


Your practice administrator can enroll your practice to support the care of Veterans in your community. To join the network, please follow the four steps below:

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EXAMPLE OF A VETERAN'S JOURNEY THROUGH THE VA COMMUNITY CARE NETWORK

- O By enrolling in the Community Care Network, practices are helping Veterans get the care they need, where they need it.
- O To guide you through this process in more detail, please follow these steps below.

ELIGIBILITY

- Veteran seeks care from VA.
- VA determines, based on community care criteria, that the Veteran is eligible for community care for this medical need.

APPOINTMENTS

- VA engages your practice to accept referral and method of delivery (referral packet includes medical record).
- Once referral is accepted, either VA schedules appointment with community care provider or Veteran schedules appointment.

GETTING CARE

- 5 Veteran receives care from your practice.
- 6 Provider sends medical record to VA.

BILLING

Provider bills Optum or TriWest for the care.

WHAT ABOUT PRESCRIPTION MEDICINE?4



- For prescription medication, the prescription should be sent to and filled by the nearest VA pharmacy
- Veterans can receive prescription medication for a 14-day or fewer supply that can be filled at a non-VA pharmacy
- A prescription for more than a 14-day supply must be filled by VA
