THE NATIONAL COMPREHENSIVE CANCER **NETWORK (NCCN) RECOMMENDS THAT BLACK MEN AND THOSE WITH A FAMILY HISTORY SHOULD BEGIN TALKING TO** THEIR DOCTOR ABOUT SCREENING AS **EARLY AS AGE 40.**



If screening shows you might have prostate cancer, your doctor may do a biopsy. If they find cancer, more tests can help show how serious it is and what treatments might work best for you.
